Are you excited for graduation? We are so psyched for you! MCC has lots of resources to make sure you can accomplish your goals after high school graduation. Whether you want to attend college, work full-time, or are still exploring career options, we are here to support you.

Career Exploration

Still not sure what you want to do after high school? Job shadowing and informational interviewing can be awesome tools to help you learn more about what a certain career or industry is really like. Setting up a job shadow opportunity can be as easy as calling a few businesses or organizations that have roles you'd like to learn more about.



For example, if you are interested in becoming a Radiologist, you might call a hospital or medical center to see if they'd allow you to shadow (aka follow around and ask questions) a Radiologist for a morning or afternoon. This can help you learn about what the day-to-day is like from professionals in the field.

Getting Ready for College: Scholarships

If you are planning to attend college after high school, scholarships and grants can be a great way to help minimize the out-of-pocket cost of post-secondary education.

MCC will be hosting a final scholarship workshop in November to help you with your essays and applications. Remember, most scholarship applications are due by the end of December.

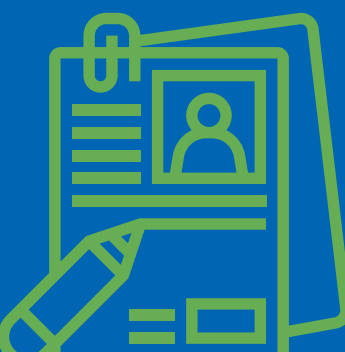

ESSAY TIPS

We know essays can be the hardest part of your scholarship application, but they are also often the determining factor for who wins scholarships.

Start your essays with a story, quote, or memory. Don't start your essay by repeating or restating the question.

Check your grammar and spelling. Use different sentence structures to make your writing more dynamic and interesting.

Save all your essays to your Google Drive. Many scholarships have similar writing prompts, so you can reuse your essays.
