Our City

Bellevue was the first settlement in Nebraska. Established in 1810, it has grown to the present community of over 65,000--the third largest city in Nebraska. Bellevue, on the southern border of Omaha, is also the home of Offutt Air Force Base and the United States Strategic Air Command. Approximately 22% of our students are dependents of military or civilian personnel working at the base.

Our School

Bellevue West, one of two senior high schools in Bellevue School District, opened its doors in the fall of 1977. Bellevue West has an enrollment of 1500 students.

It is a comprehensive high school offering courses to meet students' needs in academic, vocational, and cooperative education.

Approximately 83% of our graduates go on to postsecondary education. Bellevue West is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and High Schools.

Graduation Requirements

Class of 2024: Students must earn a minimum of 46 credits in grades nine through twelve. Class of 2025-2027: Students must earn a minimum of 50 credits. A credit is defined as the successful completion of a course that meets the equivalent of 250 minutes per week for one semester.

Summer School

In addition, 8 Advanced courses are offered for students: English 9 Advanced Geometry Advanced English 10 Advanced Algebra II Advanced American History Advanced PreCalculus Advanced Biology Advanced Chemistry Advanced

A limited summer school curriculum is held for three weeks in June. It involves six hours of daily instruction for students to make up credit missed in the previous year.
