The Bellevue Public Schools summer term program offers a continuing education opportunity for all of our students.

### **Our objectives include:**

## **One-Credit Course Offerings** All courses receive pass/fail credit and have limited space available.

**All courses listed below are open to students who are in need of credit recovery.**

### **Math:**

- Integrated Algebra I
- Geometry
- Integrated Algebra II

### **Social Studies:**

- World History
- American History

### **English:**

- English 9

### **Science:**

**Regular attendance is necessary if credit is to be earned. Students missing more than 2 days of a class for any reason will be dropped with no credit earned.**

**Absences due to vacations, appointments or school camps/activities WILL be counted toward the 2 days.**

Classes with insufficient registrations will not be offered.

## Recommendation Only COURSE OFFERINGS

**Algebra Skills:** This course is for students who have received low scores on the MAP Math Test or who have struggled with algebra concepts or failed pre-algebra.

**Requirement: Recommendation of 8th grade math teacher/counselor and incoming 9th graders only.**

**Literacy Skills:** This course is for students who have received low scores on the Map Reading Test or who have struggled with or failed Language Arts/Reading.

**Requirement: Recommendation of 8th grade English/Reading teacher/counselor and incoming 9th graders only.**

**One credit is awarded upon successful completion of a course. Summer School courses are graded as pass or fail, and course grades will not affect a student's GPA.**

## **Freshman/New Credit Course Offerings** All courses receive pass/fail credit and have limited space available.

All courses listed below are open to ALL Students who take a full schedule of academic classes and are unable to fit these electives into the regular school year.

## Discipline

Students who are sent to the office for disciplinary reasons may not be able to return to that class for the remainder of the session. If more than 50% of the session is missed, it will count as a day of absence. Excessive tardiness to class or excessive amount of time out of class may also result in a day of absence. Again, students are only allowed to miss 2 days of school. All school rules, as stated in the Parent-Student Handbook, will be enforced.

## Communication With Parents

**Electronic Communications:** All communication during Summer School will be done via email. This includes, but is not limited to: progress reports, final grade reports, and disciplinary actions and attendance.

**Attendance:** Students may only miss 2 days of the summer school term in order to earn credit. An email noting the first day of absence will be sent to the email used when registering for the summer term. The second day missed will result in a phone call. Any day missed after the second day will result in the student being dropped from the class with no credit earned.

**Reports:** Hard copies of progress reports and final grade reports WILL NOT be printed unless requested in advance. Please notify Mrs. Cook in the Dean's Office at 402-293-4162 if a different mode of communication is needed.
