Dear Junior Parents and Guardians,

As we look ahead to the spring semester, our school is committed to helping every junior feel confident and prepared for the upcoming ACT on March 24,2026. We understand how important this assessment is for college readiness and scholarship opportunities, and we want to make sure our students have the tools and support they need to succeed.

Here's what we're doing to help:

- In-School Practice Opportunities: Juniors completed the practice ACT in September to help staff understand the strengths and weaknesses of each of our students.
- ACT Prep Sessions: Starting in the second semester, we'll offer prep sessions focusing on English, math, reading, and science strategies.
- Personalized Study Resources: Students will receive access to online ACT practice materials and personalized study plans through MasteryPrep. The students have logged into this platform and are beginning to complete practice tests in the subject areas.
- Teacher Support: Our teachers across all content areas are incorporating ACT-style questions and skill review into regular classwork to reinforce key concepts.

We encourage you to talk with your student about their goals for the test and how they can take advantage of these opportunities. Details about review session times and registration will be shared in the coming weeks after winter break.

AP Exam Information 2025-26

Students enrolled in Advanced Placement classes have the opportunity to earn college credit by taking the corresponding AP exam in May 2025. The initial deadline to register for AP exams has passed; however, exams can still be ordered between November 1 st and March 1 st by paying a \$40 late fee per exam.

- • The base cost for an AP exam is \$100.00

UNMC High School Alliance

The University of Nebraska Medical Center offers a high school alliance where students have an opportunity to observe, shadow, and work alongside health care professionals and researchers at UNMC. Students take classes (2 classes each semester) on the UNMC campus from 1:00-3:00 p.m. each day. Students who are interested in pursuing a career in health care should consider applying. Class offerings may include Behavioral Health; Biology and Prevention of Cancer; Biomedical Research; Dimensions of Community Health;

Exploration of Human Anatomy; Human Genetics; The Study of Patient Care; Infectious Disease; Pathology; Pharmaceutical Science; Medical Imaging; Art and Science of Decision Making.

Eligible students must be a junior or senior (for 2026-2027 school year) and at least 16 years of age by August of 2025, have completed and received a grade of "B" or above in Algebra I, Biology, a Physical Science course, and be concurrently enrolled in a third year of science.

If students meet the requirements and are interested in applying, they should go to unmc.edu/alliance to complete the application. The due date for the UNMC High School Alliance application is January 23, 2026.
