

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM MR. ROHLFS:

Dear Parents/Guardians,

On October 7 we will be distributing a First Count Form to every student. The First Count process is used to get a reimbursement from the federal government for the loss of local tax base due to Offutt Air Force Base. We are required to collect a form from every student in order to qualify for this reimbursement. Once we have completed the First Count process the district will receive our reimbursement which goes directly back to our students for technology upgrades, building improvements and curriculum materials. A form will be given to each student in their second block class. Forms will also be emailed to the home of every student. We need a form for every student. Please help make this process as smooth as possible by returning the forms as quickly as possible. Thank you in advance for your help in supporting Bellevue Public Schools!

Attendance Matters!

Showing up for school has a major impact on a student's academic and overall success. However, more and more students are becoming **chronically absent- missing 10% or more of the school year for any reason.** This is an average of just 2 days per month. At Bellevue West, we are working to reduce the number of students who are chronically absent to help students be more successful academically and build strong habits for the future.

<u>Negative Impacts of Irregular Attendance (based on years of research):</u>

- Lower grade point averages and test scores
- Greater risk of dropping out
- Poor behavior choices due to frustration or anxiety over missed work/difficulties
- Difficulty establishing and maintaining positive relationships with peers or adults
- More likely to experience negative outcomes later in life
- Increased likelihood of unemployment after high school

Chronic absenteeism also affects the school as a whole, as well as the community. Instruction for all students is less effective when schools have high rates of chronic absenteeism. If students do not build good habits of attendance, they don't contribute to the community effectively as adults.

Ways to Help as a Parent/Guardian:

- Make school attendance a priority- talk to your student about showing up to school every day
- Help your student maintain daily routines and stay as healthy as possible
- Try (the best you can) not to schedule appointments during the school day- check the school calendar for planned no-student days or breaks
- Contact the school if your student is missing school due to anxiety or social issues
- Check your student's attendance to make sure absences aren't adding up
- Seek help from school staff, other parents, or community agencies if you need support.





Senior Checklist

For Seniors and Parents: It is extremely important that you verify the spelling of your name in PowerSchool. For your diploma, the student's name needs to be EXACTLY how it is stated on the Birth Certificate (no initials for the middle name) it needs to be the FULL NAME, ABSOLUTELY NO NICKNAMES. - Photos can be digital or print and must be front facing and vertical.
- No watermarks on photos.
- Backgrounds must not be distracting.
- Props, pets, or other people cannot be in the photo.
- School appropriate attire must be worn.
- Photos can be full color or black and white.
- Purchasing senior photos is between students/parents/guardians and photographers. The school is not involved.

Fee Waivers for Testing

Juniors and Seniors who are on Free/Reduced lunch qualify for a fee waiver for the ACT and SAT Tests. Students should see their counselor to get a fee waiver.

AP Exam Information 2025-26

- AP exams are strongly encouraged, but not required.
- Students order exams through their MyAP College Board account (myap.collegeboard.org).
- Each exam costs \$100.00 and must be paid for online at http://aptsusa.com/bwhs.
- Initial deposit of \$40 per exam is due by October 31 st, 2025. Final payment of remaining fees must be made by March 1st, 2026.
- Students who dual enroll an AP course through UNO will receive a refund of total exam fees paid once exams are completed in May.
- All other deposits are NON-REFUNDABLE.
- Exams can be ordered after November 1st for a \$40.00 late fee per exam.
- Final ordering and payment deadline is March 1, 2026.
- AP classroom provides resources for students throughout the year to review and prepare for the exam in May. Students access AP classroom through their CollegeBoard accounts.

ASVAB TESTING

If you are a junior or senior interested in taking the ASVAB test on November 6 2025, please see Mr. Schultz in the College and Career Center to sign up. Cost of the test is free. You must be signed up by October 30th.

The ASVAB measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success. It can be used as a tool for career exploration or if you are planning to join a military branch, be used to help determine military occupation placement. Students can take the ASVAB and use the Career Exploration Program WITHOUT being obligated to join the military or be contacted by a recruiter.


