Our City

The Bellevue/Offutt Community was the first settlement in Nebraska. It was settled in the 1830's, incorporated in 1855, and has grown to the present community of over 64,000. Bellevue borders the southern part of Omaha and is home of Offutt Air Force Base and the United States Strategic Command. Approximately 25% of our students are dependents of military or civilian personnel working on the base.

Our School

Bellevue East, one of two high schools in the Bellevue Public Schools, has an enrollment of about 1,500 students. It is a comprehensive high school offering courses to meet students' needs in academic, vocational, and cooperative education. Approximately 68% of our graduates go on to post-secondary education. Bellevue East is accredited by the Nebraska Department of Education and Cognia, a global accreditation agency.

Graduation Requirements

Students must earn a minimum of 46 credits. A credit is defined as the successful completion of a course that meets the equivalent of five periods per week for one semester.

Course Grading/Weighting Procedure

A student's class rank is determined by his cumulative mark point average (MPA) for grades nine through twelve. Mark point average is calculated by dividing total mark points by total credits attempted.

Converting to a 4-point scale: subtract credits earned from total mark points and divide by credits attempted.

Advanced and Advanced Placement Courses

Bellevue East offers 9 Advanced Courses which include: American History A, English 9A, English 10A, Chemistry A, Biology A, Geometry A, Algebra IIA, and Pre Calculus A.

Fourteen Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered: English 11AP, English 12AP, AB Calculus AP, BC Calculus AP, Biology AP, American Government AP, American History AP, World History AP, Physics AP1, Physics AP2, Psychology AP, Chemistry AP, Computer Science AP, Computer Science Principles AP, Statistics AP, and Art Thesis AP. Bellevue East also offers 10 Dual Enrolled courses through UNO. These include Government AP, Biology AP, AB Calculus AP, BC Calculus AP, English 12 AP, Psychology AP, Sports Medicine II, Physics AP1, Physics AP2, Spanish V, and German V.

Summer School

A limited summer school curriculum is held for four weeks during the summer. Students can attend for 6 hours per day to make up two credits missed the previous year. This is a tuition-free program for residents of Bellevue Public Schools. For more information, please contact the counseling department.
