Dean's Dispatch

- Students should be dropped off between 7:30-7:45 AM. The building will not open for students until 7:30 AM.
- Students need to be off of school property by 3:30 unless they are participating in a supervised school activity. Please arrange for transportation accordingly.
- Please make sure your student is dressed appropriately and adhering to the school dress code. See the parent/student handbook for specific information.
- Help set your student up to succeed by emphasizing the importance of being on time to school as well as being on time to each class. Vital information is shared in the first 10 minutes of class. Being on time is a key part of the formula of success.

Block Schedule

We will be utilizing an 8 period alternating block schedule this year. Classes will be 90 minutes in length and alternate every other day. There will also be a GPS (guided personal study) at the end of each day for students to get help from teachers, complete homework, and participate in various clubs and activities. There will be an Advisory class on Wednesday. The block schedule allows students to take an additional class versus the former 7 period day, allows students to focus on only 4 classes per day and allows students some flexibility and choice when planning their academic tasks for the week.

Dual Enrollment

We are fortunate to offer many dual enrollment classes where students can earn college credit through UNO or Metro Community College by simply enrolling in the dual enrollment option and paying the fee for classes they currently are taking. There are over 28 classes available and more added each semester. There is information included below and our counselors can also answer any questions for students or parents.

Drop Off and Pick Up

The parking lot is crowded during pick and drop off times. In order to keep traffic moving smoothly and to ensure students can get to school safely we ask that you plan on dropping off your student by 7:45 AM. Students arriving on the west side of the drop off should exit the car to their right, towards the stadium, and walk to the cross walk where we have a staff member assisting with the traffic flow and crossing. Students may exit the vehicle prior to the crosswalk, but should walk to the crosswalk before crossing traffic. We encourage students arriving from the east to drop off along the sidewalk and exit the vehicle once the vehicle can safely stop. Dropping off a few minutes early saves a lot of time!

Counselor's Corner Dual Enrollment/College Credit

A UNO representative will hold an informational meeting at East on August 24th at 9:30 AM in the Auditorium. Information will be provided on dual enrollment through UNO and the benefits of earning college credit while in high school. Parents are welcome to attend!! Students enrolled in AP classes and those interested in dual enrollment will be permitted to leave class to attend.

The registration deadline for UNO dual enrollment is September 29, 2023 at 11:59 pm. Students will create or log into their MavLink account and sign up online at <u>applydual.unomaha.edu</u>. Parents will receive an email after they have enrolled to confirm the registration. The \$250 dual enrollment fee for UNO covers the cost of the AP exam.

All billing takes place through the UNO offices and bills will be mailed out in October. The ACE scholarship is available to students who qualify. Information on the ACE scholarship can be found at <u>https://ccpe.nebraska.gov/ACE</u>.

Bellevue East offers several courses concurrently enrolled through Metropolitan Community College. Students will receive a paper application from their teacher in eligible classes. This form does not require a parent signature so please make sure to ask your student about their application. Registration forms will be due to their teacher by August 30th. The concurrent enrollment credits through Metro are FREE!

AP (Advanced Placement courses) Enrollment

All students enrolled in an AP class are required to have a College Board account. If students have previously taken an AP exam or the PSAT, they should log in using their credentials. If they have forgotten their login or password, they must reach out to College Board themselves to recover it. If this is their first AP class, they will need to create an account. This account allows them to access information about their class and allows them to sign up for the AP exam. AP teachers can assist students with this process. Cost is \$81 per course or \$16 for students qualifying for free or reduced lunch. Students enrolled in a dual enrollment class through UNO will receive a \$40 reimbursement per course in June. Students must sign up for an AP exam no later than November 1, 2023. After that date, they will incur a \$40 late fee to add an exam, sign up, or cancel.

Homecoming Events

The parade will be Wednesday September 13th starting at 6:30 PM. Entries will line up on Bert Murphy and the route will go north on Lincoln to High School Drive and then up to the stadium for a pep rally. There will be fireworks after the football game on Thursday 9/14.

The dance will be held on Friday 9/15 from 7:00 PM to 10:00 PM at Bellevue East. There is a full slate of athletic contests this week that can be viewed at the calendar below. **Homecoming and Prom Criteria**

Credits

Students must be on target to graduate.

- Seniors must have earned 30 credits (Homecoming) 35 credits (Prom).
- Juniors must have earned 25 credits (Homecoming) 30 credits (Prom).
- Sophomores must have earned 10 credits (Homecoming) 15 credits (as a guest Prom).
- **Freshman** must have earned 5 credits (as a guest to Prom).

Attendance

Students may not have missed 5 or more days of school prior to Homecoming and 18 or more days of school prior to Prom.

<u>Behavior</u>

Students having 3 or more days of OSS or a receiving a police citation at school are not eligible to attend.

Students Bringing Guests to Homecoming or Prom

- Guests must be under the age of 21.
- A completed form must be returned to Bellevue East by the designated deadline. NO LATE FORMS WILL BE ACCEPTED.
- Students may only bring ONE guest.
- Guests must present a photo ID at the door.
