What is Dual Enrollment or Concurrent Enrollment?

- Dual Enrollment is an opportunity for high school students to earn college credit while attending their local high school. Courses are taught at high schools by high school faculty who have advanced academic credentials and have been approved to teach these advanced courses by the supporting colleges academic departments.

Dual Enrollment

- **Advantages of Dual Enrollment**
 - College credit while in High School
 - Cheaper
 - Chance to try a college level workload while in high school.
- **Disadvantages of Dual Enrollment**
 - Colleges may not accept a credit or may apply it differently
 - The course may not be the level of challenge you are looking for.
 - Grades are permanent

Dual Enrollment

- What if my student isn't doing well in the Dual Enrollment class?
 - Option to withdraw from the college side of the course.
 - Metro Withdraw dates: Dec. 5th for 1st sem. courses
May 8th for 2nd sem. or year courses.
 - UNO Withdraw dates: Nov. 1st for 1st sem. courses
April 11th for 2nd sem courses
March 28th for year long courses
