

### **ASVAB TESTING**

If you are a junior or senior interested in taking the ASVAB test, we will be offering a spring test on April 3rd, 2025 at the Welcome Center. Please see Mr. Schultz in the College and Career Center to sign up. Cost of the test is free. You must be signed up by March 28th. The ASVAB measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success. It can be used as a tool for career exploration or if you are planning to join a military branch, be used to help determine military occupation placement. Students can take the ASVAB and use the Career Exploration Program WITHOUT being obligated to join the military or be contacted by a recruiter.
