On To College ACT Prep for Seniors

Seniors, just a reminder that you have access to the On To College ACT Test Prep by John Baylor through the end of the year. You can use the ACT Refresher Course or any of the other videos and materials to help prepare for the ACT. MAP Growth Assessment and Edmentum - What are these and how do they impact my child? MAP Growth Assessment:

- is a test that is given to all 9th and 10th graders in BPS.
- is given to students three times a year, in August, December, and May.
- is a reading test and a math test that each student takes.
- is adaptive to each student's individual learning level. No two students take the same test.
- is aligned to the Nebraska state content standards for reading and math.
- provides immediate actionable data on our students.
- provides a score using a scale that allows teachers to measure student growth over time. This scale correlates with a percentile at the grade level to allow teachers to see how students are performing.

Edmentum: is our district's intervention to be implemented for students struggling with math and reading. It is an online software program that personalizes learning for each student according to the details of their most recent MAP Score.

- Detailed scores from the MAP test are loaded into Edmentum (typically within one month of the testing window).
- Edmentum software creates an individualized learning pathway, or "Exact Path", for every student. This identifies what concepts in reading or math the student is "ready to learn now" and will start students on lessons that are theoretically within the range of their current math or reading abilities.

 West will use Edmentum with our 9th and 10th grade students identified as performing at or below the 20th percentile in regards to their MAP scores. These students will work on the personalized learning activities in Edmentum for twenty minutes, three times a week during study hall, resource or GPS.

AP Exam Information 2022-23

Students enrolled in Advanced Placement classes have the opportunity to earn college credit by taking the corresponding AP exam in May 2023. Each exam costs \$80.00. Students who qualify for free or reduced price lunch pay \$15.00 per exam. Although the deadline has passed, students can still order exams by paying a \$40.00 late fee per exam. COLLEGE & CAREER PLANNING

BPS Career Academy @ the Frank Kumor Career Center

Bellevue Public Schools currently offers three Career Academy programs within the district at the Frank Kumor Career Center. Current Sophomore and Junior students can apply for the **Certified Nursing Assistant Academy**, the **Automotive Maintenance Academy** or the **Education Career Academy**. Students in these programs will earn Dual Enrollment credit through Metro Community College. The BPS Career Academy programs are free. Transportation to and from the high school is provided.

UNMC High School Alliance

The University of Nebraska Medical Center offers a high school alliance where students have an opportunity to observe, shadow, and work alongside health care professionals and researchers at UNMC. Students take classes (2 classes each semester) on the UNMC campus from 1:00-3:00 p.m. each day. Students who are interested in pursuing a career in health care should consider applying. Class offerings may include Behavioral Health, Biology & Direction of Cancer, Biomedical Research, Dimensions of Community Health,

Exploration of Human Anatomy, Human Genetics, The Study of Patient Care, Infectious Disease, Pathology, Pharmaceutical Sciences, Medical Imaging, Art & Decision Making.

Eligible students must be a junior or senior (for 2023-2024 school year) and at least 16 years of age by August of 2023, have completed and received a grade of "B" or above in Algebra I, Biology, a Physical Science course, and be concurrently enrolled in a third year of science. If students meet the requirements and are interested in applying, they should meet with their counselor or go to UNMC High School Alliance for an application. The UNMC application will open December 15th and closes on February 3rd, 2023.

Henry Doorly Zoo Academy

The Henry Doorly Zoo Academy provides an innovative high school learning environment where students can make discoveries about the natural world and apply them to their learning. The Zoo Academy concept combines career exploration, classroom experiences, and research opportunities in a non-traditional high school setting. Students can choose either an Animal Science course pathway or a Conservation Research course pathway. This program is a 1-2 year program.

Qualifications: Sophomores & Juniors apply for 2023-2024

- *Must be on track for graduation and have excellent attendance
- *Must have completed a biology course and completion of a chemistry course is preferred
- *TB test and drug screening are required
- *Zero tolerance discipline policy

Application Required: The application is online and is due December 2, 2022. Three teacher recommendations are required. Please contact your counselor to apply.

Metro Community College Career Academies

Metro offers academies designed for high school juniors and seniors (for the upcoming 2023-2024 school year) to earn both high school and college credit. Students who are accepted take classes at Bellevue West in the morning and classes at Metro Community College in the afternoon. Possible programs being offered for the 2023-2024 school year are as follows: *Administrative Technology *Advanced Manufacturing *Architecture *Auto Collision *Automotive Technology *Business Transfer *Diesel Technology *Civil Engineering *Emergency Medical Technician *Fire Science Technology *Google Support Professional *Criminal Justice *Horticulture, Land Systems, and Management *Culinary Arts Foundations *Web Development *Digital Cinema/Filmmaking, *Early Childhood Education *Heating & Camp; A/C *IT Technician *Theatre Technology *Construction Technology *Prototype Design *Electrical Technology *Pre-Apprenticeship Plumbing *Welding Technology *3-D Animation & Camp; Games.

Eligibility requirements: high school junior or senior (for 2023-2024); on-track for graduation; be 16 years of age (by 8/2023) and meet any criteria listed in program description; must provide own transportation to/from Metro classes and internship/apprenticeship sites. Current Nebraska High School students are automatically eligible to take credit classes at no tuition cost. Cost of books is covered by the District. Students should see their counselor if they are interested in applying or go to MCC Career Academies for more information. Deadline to apply will be in early March 2023.

Metro Community College Secondary Partnership

The office of Secondary Partnerships at Metropolitan Community College supports early college experiences for high school students by providing the opportunity to earn college credit while in high school. Students can take advantage of different programs such as Career Academy, College Now!, Kickstart Online, Concurrent Enrollment and Gateway to College.
