Fee Waivers for Testing

Juniors and Seniors who are on Free/Reduced lunch qualify for a fee waiver for the ACT and SAT Tests. Students should see their counselor to get a fee waiver.

On To College ACT Prep for Seniors

Seniors, just a reminder that you still have access to the On To College ACT Test Prep by John Baylor. You can use the ACT Refresher Course or any of the other videos and materials to help prepare for the ACT. If you have questions about your access credentials to the online program, please email Mr. Schultz.

ASVAB

If you are a junior or senior interested in taking the ASVAB test on **November 9, 2022**, please see Mr. Schultz in the College and Career Center to sign up. Cost of the test is free. **You must be signed up by October 30th.** The ASVAB measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success. It can be used as a tool for career exploration or if you are planning to join a military branch, be used to help determine military occupation placement. Students can take the ASVAB and use the Career Exploration Program **WITHOUT** being obligated to join the military or be contacted by a recruiter.

MAP Growth Assessment and Edmentum - What are these and how do they impact my child?

MAP Growth Assessment:

- is a test that is given to all 9th and 10th graders in BPS.
- is given to students three times a year, in August, December, and May.
- is a reading test and a math test that each student takes.
- is adaptive to each student's individual learning level. No two students take the same test.
- is aligned to the Nebraska state content standards for reading and math.
- provides immediate actionable data on our students.
- provides a score using a scale that allows teachers to measure student growth over time. This scale correlates with a percentile at the grade level to allow teachers to see how students are performing.

Edmentum: is our district's intervention to be implemented for students struggling with math and reading. It is an online software program that personalizes learning for each student according to the details of their most recent MAP Score.

- Detailed scores from the MAP test are loaded into Edmentum (typically within one month of the testing window).
- Edmentum software creates an individualized learning pathway, or "Exact Path", for every student. This identifies what concepts in reading or math the student is "ready to learn now" and will start students on lessons that are theoretically within the range of their current math or reading abilities.
- **This year, West will use Edmentum with our 9th and 10th grade students identified as performing at or below the 20th percentile in regards to their MAP scores. These students will work on the personalized**

learning activities in Edmentum for twenty minutes, three times a week during study hall, resource or GPS.

AP Exam Information 2022-23

Students enrolled in Advanced Placement classes have the opportunity to earn college credit by taking the corresponding AP exam in May 2023. Each exam costs \$80.00. Students who qualify for free or reduced price lunch pay \$15.00 per exam. Although the deadline is passed, students can still order exams by paying a \$40.00 late fee per exam. See Ms. Polk in counseling if you wish to register.

Wellness Counselor available at Bellevue West - Angela Erickson, LIMHP

Is your student having social, emotional, and/or behavioral problems at home or school? Does your student seem to be sad, angry, worried, or have difficulty following basic rules? Bellevue Public Schools has partnered with CRCC, an independent third party agency, to help your student with counseling support. CRCC's Student Wellness Counselor at Bellevue West is Angela Erickson, a Licensed Independent Mental Health Practitioner. Her confidential counseling services can help your student put the pieces together to cope with life's stressors. Please contact your student's school counselor for more information or to make a referral. Angela is a licensed independent mental health practitioner (LIMHP) in the state of Nebraska. She earned a bachelor of science degree in psychology from the University of Utah in 2012, focusing on neurobiology and development across the lifespan. In 2016 Angela completed her master of arts in counseling from Northwestern University, specializing in working with children and adolescents, and trauma informed care.

Since beginning her counseling career in 2015, Angela has gained experience working with a wide range of patients in the private practice setting. While Angela has a broad and unique experience base as a counselor for all ages, children to geriatrics, she has a strong interest in working with and advocating for the adolescent population as they transition through the many emotional and physiological changes that take place during this time of their lives.

Angela offers supportive, encouraging, and strength based treatment options with a holistic, integrative approach to client-centered therapy, using traditional psychodynamic and family systems work, cognitive behavioral techniques, dialectical behavior techniques, and motivational interviewing. Angela has diversified experience working with trauma related disorders, complex personality disorders, mood disorders, schizophrenia, complicated grief, and is trained in EMDR, clinical hypnosis, and is currently training to become a registered play therapist.
