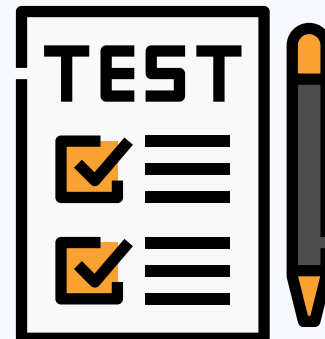

## September 16th Testing Day

September 16th will be all school test day at Bellevue West HS. All students in grades 9, 10, and 11 will take the practice ACT on that day. **12th graders don't have school.**

## PSAT/NMSQT Exam

Bellevue West will be offering the PSAT/NMSQT on **Tuesday, October 28th** for any interested 9th, 10th, & 11th grade students.

Cost for the exam is **\$20**

Deadline to sign up for the PSAT is the end of the day, **Wednesday, September 3rd!!**

To register for the test, please **bring your payment to the Counseling office.**

The PSAT/NMSQT exam assesses the academic skills that students have developed over the years, primarily through their coursework. These skills are considered essential for success in high school, college, and career.

The PSAT is co-sponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation. You must take the PSAT in 11th grade in order to be considered for the National Merit Scholarship Program.

# Testing Information

## AP Exam Information 2025-26

Dear AP Students and Families,

Welcome to the 25-26 school year and the opportunity to earn college credit or advancement by enrolling in Advanced Placement classes. Taking the AP exam is an important culmination to an Advanced Placement class. Bellevue West High School encourages all students currently enrolled in an AP class to register for and take the corresponding exam in May of 2026.

### How to Register for an AP Exam

- Create a College Board account or login to your account at [myap.collegeboard.org](https://myap.collegeboard.org).
- Be sure to make a note of your username and password for accessing AP Classroom throughout the year
- Connect to each of your AP classes using the specific join code from your teacher/class section
- Set your exam decision indicator to “YES” for each exam you would like to order for testing in May
- Any account left set to “Undecided” or “No” by October 31st, 2025 will not have an exam ordered, including students who dual enroll through UNO.

### Payment of Fees for AP Exams

- The cost of each AP exam is \$100.00; Payments can be made online only through a check or credit card.

#### **NO PAYMENTS WILL BE ACCEPTED AT SCHOOL**

- A \$40.00 deposit per exam ordered is due by October 31, 2025.
- The total cost of each AP exam for students who qualify for free or reduced price lunch is \$40.00.
- Dual enrollment students who wish to test must register for exams through MyAP and make the \$40 deposit by October 31, 2025.
- Students who dual enroll an AP course through UNO will have the cost of the exam for that course paid for by UNO.
- **PLEASE NOTE:** All students who plan to test in May MUST make a \$40 deposit online for each exam ordered through MyAP.
- Deposits are NON-REFUNDABLE, except for UNO dual enrollment students that complete the exam in May. Refunds will be issued in June once testing is complete.
- ALL EXAM FEES FOR 25-26 LESS ANY DEPOSITS ARE DUE BY MARCH 1, 2026.

### Other Important Information

- Exams ordered between Nov. 1, 2025 and March 1, 2026 will be charged a \$40.00 late fee PER EXAM.
- Balance due will be billed in January through APTS, our online payment system.
- No exams can be ordered after March 1, 2026.
