Bellevue Public Schools partners with families and the community to help ignite a love of learning in children. The programs are intended to complement the education that a child receives at home through playtime, books, and conversation.

All early childhood programs are provided at no cost to the family.

Early Childhood Center

The Early Childhood Center is an educational center intended for children birth to eight years old and their parents.

The parents must accompany their children while participating in the center's activities.

The family must reside within the Bellevue Public Schools attendance area or military families.

Home and Community-Based Special Education Services

Children who qualify for services age birth to three are served based on their Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP).

Children age three to five are served based on their Individual Education Plan (IEP).

Preschool

Bellevue Public Schools' Preschool Program Serves

children who are 4 years of age (by July 31st). Children qualify for the program in two ways. One way is based on a screening process, which identifies potential risk factors for development. In addition, the preschool program services children who have qualified for Special Education Services through an evaluation process and have a verified educational disability with a current IEP. All related services identified on the IEP are provided within the preschool classroom setting.
