TalNexus Scholarship

Deadline: September 2020

Award: Up to \$4,000 Overview: The TalNexus Scholarship for a Master in Fine Arts Degree offers grants of up to \$4,000 for storytellers (writers and filmmakers) pursuing degrees in Masters in Fine Arts. The award recognizes applicants of demonstrated talent in their craft and a commitment to exploring themes of individuality, community and innovation – broadly imagined – in their works. Scholarship winners will be automatically accepted into Taliesin Nexus' Writers Workshop (or the Film Lab, if more applicable). Our workshops are entirely free, including tuition and room and board. We also provide travel stipends of up to around \$400 for those coming from out of state.

Graham Foundation Grants to Individuals

Deadline: September 15, 2020

Award Amount: Up to \$20,000

Overview: These grants assist individuals with the production-related expenses that are necessary to take a project from conceptualization to realization and public presentation. These projects include, but are not limited to, publications, exhibitions, installations, films, and new media projects.

VADA KINMAN-OLDFIELD SCHOLARSHIP -

Deadline: September 24

Award: \$2,000 (or \$1,000 if two are tied) Criteria: This is an essay contest open to all Nebraska students to be used at any college in Nebraska. You must write an essay of 1,000 words or less about a Nebraska veteran, explaining why that veteran should be honored. The veteran you write about must be honorably discharged and either a Nebraska native or a long-time resident of Nebraska. You should type the essay and include a title page with your name, contact information, and the name of our school. Do not include your name on the actual essay. Deliver your essay to the counseling office during September for consideration. We can only submit two essays from our school and we will mail those on October 1.

Don't Text and Drive Scholarship -

Deadline September 30

For this scholarship you will write a 140 character message about texting while driving.
